A Project Funded by the European Union

Context



- EU and China are both dedicated to enhance strategic cooperation on climate change.
- China is promising to launch the largest ETS in the world this year.
- The previous stage of ETS related cooperation between EU and China (2014-2017) grounded the cornerstone for further collaboration.
- The leading peer experience of EU-ETS is highly valuable for China.



- To strengthen the bilateral cooperation on climate change between EU and China through provide support for Chinese ETS
- To solidify the commonsense of EU and China in terms of the role of carbon pricing tools to address climate change through dialogue and exchange
- To provide programmatic support for Chinese ETS through implementation of demand-driven activities
- To enhance the capacity of key stakeholders through well-designed capacity building towards government and enterprises

Key Components

Component A: Policy Dialogue and Joint Research

Component B: Capacity Building for Institution and networking of trainers

- Organise annual PSC meeting
- Support for EU-China ETS Policy Dialogue
- Deploy the Joint-research upon the demand of Chinese ETS

- Conduct the training for national and regional governmental or institutional representatives
- Establish the trainers network for outreach training activities

Component C: capacity building for enterprises Component D: Flexibility

- Carry out physical trainings for ETS covered enterprises
- Develop and apply online training platform to deliver virtual trainings furtherly
- Deliver any activity base on the ad hoc demand of MEE and agreement of DG CLIMA

Main activities and outputs under Component A

- Joint Research Activities
 - Selected CN and EU experts have been working together selected topics
 - Develop practical solutions and recommendations to critical issues identified by MEE
- Date to May 2020
 - Joint Reserach Group 1 (JR1) : Transition of pilots to national system (closed in Sept 2019)
 - Joint Research Group 2 (JR2): Market information disclosure and supervision (to be closed in June 2020)
 - Joint Research Group 3 (JR3): Benchmark of allowance allocation in industral sectors (steel, Chemical) (launched in May 2020)
 - Other new Joint Research Groups: in the consulation with MEE





Main activities and outputs under Component B

- 26 trainings have been delivered successfully by the end of 2019
- 20 provincial administrative regions and 3 provincial level municipalities
- More than 4,500 regional governmental representatives received the training offered







Main activities and outputs under Component C

- Delivered successfully 19 regional trainings across China
- Trained **2,607** industry representatives who are mainly from power sector, as well as other related industrial sectors, such as cement and building materials, non-ferrous metals, aviation, etc.
- Endorsed **124** experts with diversified background, including national think-tanks, research institutions, the third-party verifiers, peer leading enterprises, experienced traders, etc.
- Produced more than 130 presentations covering ETS relevant knowledge and skills by different modules, including policies and rules, allowance allocation, MRV, trading strategy and simulation, carbon asset management, registry, etc.
- Received positive feedback from more than 95% of trainees and local EPAs in terms of organisation and contents of trainings





Main activities and outputs under Component D

1. Large-scale allowance allocation trial and training workshops

17 large-scale trainings covering **4631** participants from **27** provinces and **4** cities participated in the training workshops, and around **141** experts have been endorsed for the trainings.

2. Study tour to Germany

A **14-day intensive training in Germany** was delivered from 3rd-14th November 2019. The participants include **12 officials** from local and central competency authority, and **10 seniors from State**-**Owned Enterprises**, covering power generation and 5 industrial sectors.





Looking ahead

- More joint research groups will be mobilised to study key issues for the sake of supporting the launch and operation of Chinese ETS.
- 2. Deliver continually the high-quality trainings combining physical and digital ways to adapt to the crisis of COVID-19.
- 3. Keep intensive consultation with MEE of China and DG CLIMA of EU to address well their demands and provide effective support.
- 4. Open exchange and communication with different international stakeholders to demonstrate dedicated efforts in addressing climate change through bilateral cooperation.
- 5. Figure out innovatively more valuable segments for consideration of any possibly further cooperation.
